Evaluation

At the exam (Evaluation Day), each student has to give a concise and well-illustrated presentation of not more than 15 minutes, describing the process and results of the semester project as well as the experiences and knowledge acquired during the work.

Results of the Audiovisual Studies course are to be played on a screen. The Photography Project, the Audiovisual Studies video, and the essays for the Art Market & Networking course are to be completed before the examination (Evaluation Day). Marking is based on the work during the semester, the presentation of the works and the oral presentation. Respective marks of the individual courses will be averaged proportionately of 60-30-10 per cent. Failing any of the courses will result in failing the Photography Project subject.
