1. Course Description and Objectives

The primary objective of the course is to develop students' communicative competence in Hungarian and to provide them with an introduction to Hungarian culture.

The course is designed for students participating in higher education and aims to familiarize them with Hungarian culture, the major sights and landmarks of Hungary and Budapest, Hungaricums, and prominent figures in Hungarian history and culture.

Particular emphasis is placed on the development of students' practical language skills in speaking and oral interaction, reading comprehension, writing and text production, and listening comprehension.

2. Course Content / Topics

1. Introduction to the Hungarian Language and Its Specific Features

Greetings, introductions, and basic communicative expressions.

2. Numbers and Telephone Communication

Numbers, telephone numbers, and emergency telephone numbers in Hungary. Nationalities and languages.

3. Housing and Place of Residence

Describing a home and place of residence. Major sights and landmarks of Budapest. Adjectives.

4. Social Relationships, Family and Friends

Family and social relationships. Outstanding and prominent Hungarians. Occupations. Formal and informal forms of address.

5. Shopping and Hungarian Food Culture

Shopping in Budapest and at the market. Hungarian food and beverages. Hungaricums.

6. Expressing Time

Telling the time, parts of the day, days of the week, and the seasons in Hungary.

7. Public Transportation in Budapest

Getting around Budapest. Directions and ordinal numbers.

8. Hungary: Geography and Places

Rivers, mountains, and lakes of Hungary. Presenting one's hometown.

9. Services and Eating Out in Hungary

Everyday services and communication in a Hungarian restaurant. Reading a menu and ordering food. Presenting one's favourite Hungarian dish.

10. Hungarian Holidays and Traditions

Major Hungarian holidays and the customs and traditions associated with them.

3. Student Assignments

Students are required to complete a presentation and an essay as part of the course requirements.

4. Assessment

Method of Assessment

The course concludes with a two-component final examination consisting of an oral and a written examination.

The assessment follows a two-grade (pass/fail) system. Students achieve a passing grade upon attaining at least 60% of the total score.

- Communicative competence
- Listening comprehension
- Grammatical accuracy
