Course description:

The aim of the course is transforming **emotions and stories** into complex lighting concepts. The task is beginning with a guided, short research on the emerging themes ended up with moodboard making. Next task is the creation of real-life **spatial lighting situations** in the form of scale models using projectors and other light sources.

The end result of the project is a photo and/or video of the model, so the quality of the modelling is less important.

Application
