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Aim and principles of the course:

This course aims to provide curatorial, technical and organizational background to the third Work in Context Symposium on Central European Photography.

Students will participate in an exclusive editorial team responsible for the communication with guest lecturers, media and academic partners, they will contribute to the communication of the event, participate in the installation of the accompanying exhibition and be in charge of the supportive tasks during the event.

The course is led by the curators of the symposium, Judit Gellér, Zsolt Petrányi, and Gábor Arion Kudász. Students will work in a small editorial board of 5 persons.

Learning outcomes (professional and general competencies to be developed):

Knowledge: Students understand the importance of networking and planning. Students acquire practice-based knowledge of how an editorial team operates, and what are the duties of participants. They know the
