Topic

// 1. Designing a book series, along with basic Indesign and typography

Parts:

- -Designing the cover of a book series consisting of 6 elements in the Fiction theme
- -Choosing one title out of the six, designing the frontispiece and title quarter
- -Creating six illustrations for the selected title and inserting the corresponding text
- -On Thursdays of the course, Indesign and typography basics practice
- +Maintaining sketchbook(s) during the course

Content

During the semester course, we will build six elements of a book series using a typography and illustration system. Students will learn about different aspects of book series design, the basic rules of typography, and the basics of Indesign. We practice the variation possibilities of the system and its elements, which are very important in the design process (color coding, sign, typography as an expressive tool, style, form, variability). A book design with illustrations is created for the selected title, which presents the formal and ideological nature of the book series. At the end of the course, there is a presentation in which the students present the path they took to the solution, the different systems they experimented with during the course, and a mock-up of the selected title is also created.
