Introduction to Academic Writing in English course 2 builds on the topics covered in course 1. The course begins with individual tutorials where we will discuss your individual objectives for the week. The rest of the week will focus on individual development of a part of your PhD/DLA text/plan.

Rather than work from readings that I set, this course invites you to introduce and discuss an example of writing you admire. This could be an academic or non-academic source (fiction or fact). The example could be a short excerpt of a longer whole, an abstract, or a portion of an introduction, conclusion or chapter. In your short presentations on day 2 try to reflect on what drew you to the text and how this inspiration might be brought into your own writing.
