## AdaptationS / with Paulien Oltheten: On how to become a routine

## Theme:

Urban environments face increasingly severe climate challenges, necessitating immediate responses from their inhabitants. This photography research project explores creative ways of resilience and adaptation within city landscapes, documenting how communities confront and adjust to environmental changes. The project consisting of a week-long workshop captures both the subtle and

dramatic ways urban lifestyles adapt to climate stressors. Participants share knowledge of different artistic and design disciplines while experimenting with alternative use of materials while collectively embracing the sour irony of current tendencies. Using mainly photography and video the workshop leads and participants visualize observable and possible transformations, aiming to foster a deeper understanding of urban resilience.
